

CHC43115 Certificate IV in Disability

COURSE OVERVIEW

- The CHC43115 Certificate IV in Disability qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of community settings and clients' homes who provide training and support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing.
- With this qualification, workers promote a person-centred approach work without direct supervision and may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.
- The course is fully accredited Nationally Recognised Training.

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- There are no formal entry requirements for this course, however it is expected that students have good communication skills and a genuine interest working with and caring for the elderly and disabled.
- Be aware that working in this industry will require you to obtain a National Police check prior to commencing employment. Other States and Territories outside NSW have similar guidelines and if you move around Australia it is advisable to check with local licensing authorities. If you want to work in the ACT for example, you will also need to undergo a Working with Vulnerable People check.
- Be aware also that most care facilities will require that workers are physically fit and emotionally capable of working in the environment. This also means that workers do not have a pre-existing medical condition or a communicable disease that may put the health and safety of the client and other staff at risk.

DURATION & STRUCTURE

The course combines face to face classroom-based learning, workplace based practical placement and assessment and self-paced study. The program runs on a rotating calendar cycle, with students able to commence study at regular intervals and take up to 6 months to complete the qualification.

Weekly sessions consist of face-to-face training in a classroom based environment, learning the underpinning theoretical components and required knowledge. In addition, you are required to do supported online training away from the classroom each week.

Students are required to attend complete 120 hours of practical placement and assessment. You will receive all learning and assessment materials electronically so you can access them at all times.
